Welcome to High School


We'd like to extend a warm welcome to all of our High School families for 2023, and trust that the start to the Term has been a smooth one.

The College community would like to congratulate the Year 12 class of 2022 on the success achieved throughout the year.

Every graduating student achieved their South Australian Certificate of Education, as has been the case for many years at Cedar. This is a significant achievement, especially when one considers the additional COVID-related challenges faced by this group of students throughout the senior years of their schooling.

In terms of the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR), 17% of our graduating Year 12s achieved an ATAR of greater than 90, placing them in the top 10% of students in South Australia. Additionally, 53% of our students achieved an ATAR of 80 or more, placing them in the top 20% of students in the state. To have such a high percentage of our students ranked in the top 20% of South Australian students is an amazing achievement. It is also worth noting that 89.3% of the grades awarded to our Year 12s in 2022 were either an A or a B, and this represents further improvement from previous years. Our students also received 8 SACE Merits for outstanding achievement within a subject.

Tertiary Pathways

Further to this, 98% of our students applying for a University course received a first-round offer, and of these students, 80% were offered their first preference course (these figures always rise after subsequent offer rounds). It is exceptionally pleasing to see so many of our students able to pursue the pathway of their choice. We continue to be very proud of the outstanding results that our Year 12s achieve and feel extremely blessed to be part of a school community where students can fulfil their God-given academic gifts, and progress to exciting post-school opportunities and pathways.

The completion of Year 12 is the culmination of many years of effort and hard work, and all students should be proud of their achievements. Cedar wishes each member of the 2022 Year 12 cohort God's richest blessings as they pursue study and employment in the coming years.

STOP at the kerb.

LOOK in all directions for traffic

LISTEN to the sounds of traffic.

THINK about when it is safe to cross.

Always check that all vehicles have stopped and only cross if the road is clear.
