Decoding Literacy

Over the last term, our Reception to Year 6 teachers have been doing a wonderful job of implementing our new Literacy program, *Playberry Laser*. We have been thrilled with the progress made so far and are excited to see this continue.

The Playberry Laser approach is in line with the most recent research and evidence available to ensure we are teaching all students to read and spell in the most effective and efficient way. This research and evidence has been drawn from a body of work known as the "Science of Reading". The Science of Reading draws on research from relevant disciplines such as education, literacy, psychology, and neurology, providing information on how the brain best learns to read.

A key part of our Literacy program at Cedar College includes students taking home readers in order to consolidate the skills of reading. This year, there have been some significant changes in the way our school approaches the reader system. Our insights into the Science of Reading have reshaped the way we think about the books that are sent home. We now use decodable readers, which are books that contain only phonetic code that students have already learnt. Their knowledge of phonics and word analysis skills enables them to decode unfamiliar words so they can read every word, consolidate their learning, develop fluency, and experience success. Our decodable readers are aligned to the Playberry Laser program taught in classrooms.

Our Reception to Year 2 parents and caregivers are invited to attend an Information Evening on Thursday the 16th of May at 6pm in the Library, to hear more about the Science of Reading and how decodable texts are being used at Cedar College. We are excited to welcome Linda Clune, a Playberry Laser specialist with over 20 years' experience working with Primary School aged children, to speak at this special event.
